## COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT

Through the Community Management Plan (CMP), PT Agincourt Resources (PTAR) has identified the economic and social impacts of its operations.

The company has developed a number of social responsibility (CSR) programs focused on five key areas:

Due to restrictions in relation to health protocols during the COVID-19 pandemic, PT Agincourt Resources (PTAR) has diverted part of its CSR budget for COVID-19 direct assistance activities. In collaboration with the central and local governments, the Company assists in the preparation of medical equipment and equipment and also the assignment of doctors to assist local health centers.

## COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Activities of appreciation and preservation of local wisdom include:



**Preservation of local culture: Gondang Topap**  
E-coaching and virtual performance



**Youth & Sports Development: Marathon**  
Exercise with health protocols and virtual national race.



**Encouraging village independence for good governance**  
Three villages were selected as pilot projects: Telo Village, Batuhula Village and Kelurahan Muara Hutaraja.



**Disaster risk reduction: Resilient Villages (Desa Tanggap Bencana or "Destana")**  
In collaboration with READY Indonesia as a partner to carry out Capacity Building - Disaster management training for Destana volunteers.



**Disaster risk reduction: Capacity building for the fire fighting units in South Tapanuli District**  
In collaboration with Emergency Response Team (ERT), PTAR carried out the Basic Fire Fighting training which was attended by 30 firefighters. PTAR handed over assistance in the form of basic firefighting equipment.



**Religious program**  
Virtual Christmas Celebration and donations for 545 families.



**Assistance for victims of natural disasters**  
Assistance for flood victims in 18 villages, Barus Sub-district, Central Tapanuli District.



**Community site visit to the Martabe Gold Mine**  
Total visitors in 2020 are 226 people. During the pandemic, the activity was suspended.

## PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE

PT Agincourt Resources (PTAR) supported several public infrastructure construction projects in 2020, including:



Renovation of bathing, washing, and latrine facilities in Aek Ngadol Village.



Renovation of the walls and facade of the Nurul Huda Mosque building in Aek Pining.



The construction of a 70 m long suspension bridge in Sumuran.



Renovation of the women's bathroom at Huta Godang equipped with a septic tank.



Renovation of the ablution place of the Muhammadiyah Taqwa Mosque in Batuhula Village, Batangtoru Sub-district.



Mosque renovation in the form of building structures, roofs, domes and floors.



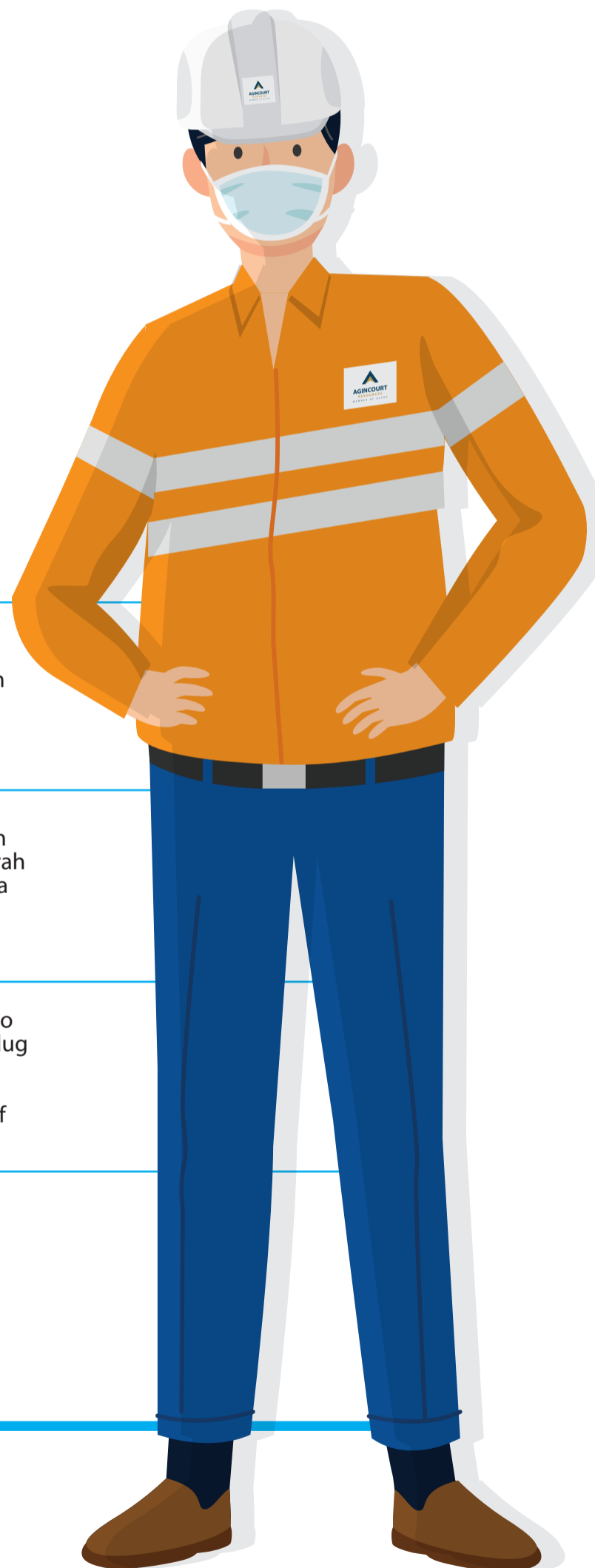
Clean water facilities in Telo Village are in the form of dug wells as a source of clean water and construction of partition walls and roofs of wells in 4 locations.

## HEALTH

The COVID-19 pandemic has made PT Agincourt Resources (PTAR) divert some of its social responsibility programs in the health sector to assist the government in efforts to prevent and handle COVID-19.



Specialist doctor program at the Public Health Center in Batangtoru and Muara Batangtoru Districts.

- Pediatrician services **635** patients
- Gynaecology specialist services **786** patients
- Internal medicine specialist services **384** patients
- Facilities assistance in the form of a 12-channel Electrocardiogram (EKG) and blood sugar test kits.



Supervised & an evaluation the program with Health Agency and Public Health Center.

- Joint evaluation with the South Tapanuli District Health Agency in the 2019 health implementation program and the implementation of the 2020 program plan strategy.
- Agreement on priority program partnerships between PTAR and the Health Agency and Public Community Center
- Verification of service quality improvement based on the recommendations of the 2020-2003 health program roadmap.



Free medical services for **170** patients for areas far from the center of access to public health services in Muara Ampolu Village.



COVID-19 assistance to the community and government from the national, provincial, district and sub-district levels, including:

- North Sumatra Province through Energy and Mineral Resources Agency
- South Tapanuli District
- Central Tapanuli District
- Padangsidempuan City
- Sibolga City



Recovery of malnutrition by giving formula and regular checkups to a pediatrician for 3 toddlers.



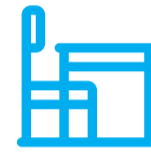

Model school program towards National Education Standards and partnership with PT United Tractors Tbk. in encouraging vocational education majoring in heavy equipment engineering



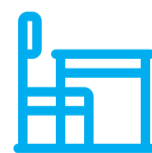
Although teaching and learning activities in 2020 were abolished, but some activities can be carried out virtually.



**Martabe Prestasi Scholarship**  
Providing access to quality education for 200 students from underprivileged families in Batangtoru and Muara Batangtoru sub-districts.



**The evaluation and strengthening program of school quality management** is carried out by involving the Institute for Quality Assurance of Education (LPMP) of North Sumatra Province.



**Improving school facilities** in the form of the distribution of 300 tables and 600 chairs to 16 elementary schools in the directly affected villages.



**Vocational school program** towards National Education Standards and partnership with PT United Tractors Tbk. in encouraging vocational education majoring in heavy equipment engineering at SMKN II.

PTAR has distributed safety centre simulation equipment and 104 units of TAB workshop hand tools and safety centre installations by vocational school safety learning standards.

## LOCAL BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

PT Agincourt Resources (PTAR) seeks to contribute to developing local businesses by supporting income diversification, including:



Increasing agricultural diversification and productivity



Increasing the number and capacity of local suppliers and contractors



Vocational skills development

Some of the activities that have been carried out:



- 1 Integrated Livestock Development - Goat**  
Initiating an integrated livestock development program through empowering youth groups in Aek Pining Village
- 2 Intensification of Rhizome Root Cultivation**  
Provide assistance to 2 community groups, namely the Makmur Jaya Group in Bandar Hapinis Village which manages 2 ha of rhizome root cultivation and the Torop Jaya Women's Farmer Group in Sumuran Village which manages 1.2 ha of land.
- 3 Capacity building of ASIK Fishery Group with Maggot Cultivation**  
The dependence of residents on providing synthetic feed for carp and tilapia cultivation is slowly being minimized by using natural, environmentally friendly feed using maggots. This reduces feed costs by up to 40%.
- 4 Improving the quality of organic rice seeds**  
Provide some new seeds such as *hitam cempo*, *menthik wangi* and *pandan wangi* as new variants to meet the market needs.
- 5 Agricultural facility assistance**  
Assist to farmer groups in the Pulogodang rice fields in the form of 1 unit of farmer's hut with storage and a 250-m long concrete rebate road and also assistance in repairing irrigation ditches in Aek Pahu rice fields.
- 6 Cultivation of fruit crops**  
Assistance and supervision of several fruit crop cultivation programs such as bananas in Benteng Sub-village, Hapesong Baru Village, and hybrid coconuts in Sumuran Village and fruit plants growing in pots in 5 Directly Affected Villages (DAVs).
- 7 Mentoring women's business groups**

  - a. The Makmur Jaya Women's Group in Bandar Hapinis and the Torop Jaya Women's Group in Sumuran received assistance from PTAR in developing processed rhizome root products.
  - b. Development of South Tapanuli Batik in Kampung Pasit, Kelurahan Aek Pining. Meeting the demand for the
